Oh rallies to claim national title

South Korean table tennis whiz Oh Sang-Eun had to fight all the way to capture the men's A-grade open singles title at the New Zealand championships in Christchurch yesterday.

The former world No 5 is the most high-profile name to compete in a tournament in this country.

He won silver in the teams event at last year's London Olympics and also made the quarterfinals in the singles at the 2008 Beijing Olympics.

The 36-year-old did not have it all his own way in the final against second seeded Aucklander Teng Teng Liu.

Liu claimed the first set 11-7, before Oh fought back to grab the second 11-9. Liu responded, taking the third set 11-9, before Oh's class finally began to tell winning the next three sets to take the title.

Oh was also victorious in the men's doubles with Auckland's Phillip Xiao. They were too powerful for the Otago pairing of Miroslav Janca and Jesper Villadsen, winning the final three sets to love [11-3, 11-3, 12-10].

Canterbury-based former Serbian international Timea Tapai was the dominant player in the women's competition.

She was too accurate for Auckland's Lu Guiting in the women's A-grade singles final, winning 11-6, 11-8, 11-7,

Tapai teamed up with Manawatu's Catherine Zhou in the women's doubles. They crushed the Auckland duo of Kim Jung Mi and Vicky Yang

Tapai added a third national title to her collection, sealing victory in the mixed doubles with provincial teammate Yi-Sien Lin.

Tapai and Lin prevailed over Jongeub Han (Canterbury) and Kim Jung Mi (Auckland) 11-3, 11-6, 11-2
