01 PRESIDENT'S REPORT

At last year's AGM, I stood in front of you all and said I was here to represent the people of Table Tennis Canterbury and am pleased to say that this year I have done that to the best of my ability. I am proud to have been president for 2022 and of the Management Committee and the strides we have collectively taken to grow community and programmes for members who love the sport of table tennis at all levels.

Throughout the year I have endeavoured to make myself available to anyone who wants to chat and have worked at being available, discussing all topics with transparency and honesty.

Spending time in the stadium including twelve weeks as administrator whilst waiting on the appointment of Renata Jelli was a real grassroots experience of what it takes to run an organisation such as this and hopefully my digital skills improved during this time. Not bad for a 78 year old!

This year we have instituted a Table Tennis Canterbury initiative; a group coaching scheme to provide coaching across all levels and at an affordable price to all. These were heavily supported, with John Cordue as coach supported by Jaafar Moussa.

We've had strong uptake of people playing in our two person competition and we'd also like to thank Craig Dye for his innovative work to produce the new Superclub format, to give our top players a more professional and competitive interclub competition. Live streaming of Superclub has been very significant in engaging viewing by people locally and all around the world.

Regarding the earthquake repairs, evidence of what has been achieved this year is all around you and I would like to extend an enormous thank you to Simon Fenwick and his team of volunteers for the many hours getting the repairs to the stage they are at. Without his expertise and knowledge we would not be here today in an almost repaired stadium with a floor meeting ITTF standards and enabling us to have more exciting projects to follow in 2023 (see report below).

Thank you also to those on our Interclub, Player
Development and Tournament sub-committees for all their
work this year. Thanks to all those who helped us host the
South Island 2022 Senior and Junior teams championships

and the Canterbury Open. Special thanks to Grant Wilson as he leaves the committee in 2023 for all his years in the role of Junior Development Officer and as Vice President this year, his expertise and experience are highly valued.

COVID restrictions changed up and down during the year and keeping everyone informed of all the correct protocols has kept our Health and Safety Sub-committee busy. We're grateful once again that we are now back to business as usual.

Our Governance and HR Sub-committee have been busy employing a new stadium administrator, (welcome Renata)! and dealing with all the day-to-day issues, running the Special General Meeting earlier in the year, and now the AGM.

We've worked at cleaning all of our spaces, updating all the notice boards and signage, engaging with our people on Facebook and working on the new website.

The Property Sub-committee has dealt with everything from blocked toilets to security lights, minor repairs, more trimming trees, weed spraying, etc. and making our spaces welcoming. As a committee we are upgrading our systems with a new computer and software in the office.

Many thanks to Kris Alisch for her work on grant funding and finance this year. We have been very privileged to have somebody with such expertise in this role.

I'd also like to thank Helen Beumelburg for her work as Secretary. Not having had someone in the role for many years she has been a huge part of keeping people informed. Communication in todays digital world is a necessity for any organization.

It's been a very fulfilling year and a real learning curve for all of us. I have enjoyed the diversity and balance of this committee, both male and female, from juniors to the more mature, all contributing their specialist skill bases and wish to thank them all for their work this year.

Congratulations also to our members receiving National awards at the TTNZ AGM on December 3rd. Gina Lui , National Veteran of the year, Alan Moore, National Official of the Year and myself for National Volunteer of the Year recognition. It has been an honour to serve you all.

02 | EQC UPDATE

This year has seen significant progress in our earthquake claim. This had previously been stalled due to an inability to assess the conditions of the slab due to it being covered by our wooden floor.

It was agreed to remove the floor in November 2022, and the floor was assessed and surveyed by 6 experts from our side and the insurer's. There are between 12 and 20 cracks in the slab that are likely to have been caused by the 2020/11 earthquakes. The insurer has subsequently agreed to go to mediation where a final cash settlement figure is to be negotiated. This typically happens on the same day. We have a mediator lined up whom both sides are happy with, and this will happen at the latest before the end of January 2023.

From then the committee will decide on how best to proceed with funds received.

04 FINANCIAL REPORT & SUMMARY

I am pleased to report TTC operated sustainably over the 2021-22 financial year, recording a Net Surplus of \$48,692 (2021: \$16,248).

The above table demonstrates that TTC has been improving its financial position this year both in terms of profitability as well as net assets which is largely due to a diligent focus on the financial management of the organisation.

We have reviewed our revenue streams and made some changes to our invoice and financial recording system to ensure invoices are issued correctly and timely; and outstanding payments (receivables) are followed up. Examples are car park leasing and school/group bookings resulting in an increase of \$10K to the previous year.

Our business as usual (interclub and stadium hire) was slightly more profitable, and income increased from \$90K to 96K whilst stadium expenses were up marginally due to increased power and cleaning costs.

Grants and donations have also increased. Substantial funding is expected for the next financial year which will be raised for the next phase of the stadium upgrade/development following the completion of our EQC claim.

With regard to other expenses, travel was up by \$8K due to TTC subsidising travel to the Southern Regional Junior Training camp and the National Junior & Senior Championships in Auckland which was funded by grants and donations.

Employee expenses are notably down which is due to employee changes and reduced casual employee activity. I would like to acknowledge the valued contribution of our volunteers who covered the stadium administrator role for several months during the recruitment process mid this year.

All of the above measures proved effective and have set us in good stead for the year ahead.

Independent auditor's report

To the Members of Table Tennis Canterbury Incorporated

Qualified Opinion

We have audited the special purpose financial statements of Table Tennis Canterbury Incorporated on pages 6-11, which comprise the statement of financial position as at 30 September 2022, and the statement of financial performance, statement of movements in equity, and the statement of accounting policies and notes to the financial statements.

In our opinion, except for the possible effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph, the accompanying special purpose financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Table Tennis Canterbury Incorporated as at 30 September 2022, and its financial performance for the year then ended in accordance with the stated accounting policies set out in the notes to the financial statements.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

In common with other organisations of a similar nature, controls over cash collection on behalf of the club by volunteers prior to it being recorded are limited, and there are no practical audit procedures to determine the effect of this limited control. The auditor's report on the prior year, as previously issued, included a qualified opinion on the same basis. The prior year's audit report was issued on 1 March 2022.

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (New Zealand) (ISAs (NZ)). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the 'Auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements' section of our report.

We are independent of Table Tennis Canterbury Incorporated in accordance with Professional and Ethical Standard 1 (Revised) 'Code of ethics for assurance practitioners' issued by the New Zealand Auditing and Assurance Standards Board, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Other than in our capacity as auditor we have no relationship with, or interests in, Table Tennis Canterbury Incorporated.

Basis of Accounting and Restriction on Distribution and Use

1 Statement of Accounting Policies

Reporting Entity

Table Tennis Canterbury Incorporated is an Incorporated society registered under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908. The club offers table tennis facilities for members of affiliated societies.

Statement of Compliance and Basis of Preparation

The Financial Statements of Table Tennis Canterbury Incorporated have been prepared as special purpose financial statements which have been prepared for the purpose of use by its' members.

The accounting principles recognised as appropriate for the measurement and reporting of the financial performance and financial position on an historical cost basis are followed by the club.

These financial statements are presented in NZ dollars (NZ\$) and rounded to the nearest whole dollar unless otherwise stated

Specific Accounting Policies

The following specific accounting policies which materially affect the measurement of the financial performance and financial position have been applied:

a) Furniture and fittings

Furniture and fittings are recognised at cost less aggregate depreciation. Depreciation has been calculated using rates management deemed to be most appropriate based on their use. Gains and losses on disposal of fixed assets are considered in determining the operating result for the year.

Furniture and fittings 10%

b) Revaluation

Freehold land and buildings are revalued on a cyclical basis.

Valuations are to the latest Christchurch City Council rates valuation. Revaluations are transferred to the asset revaluation reserve for the class of assets. If any revaluation reserve has a deficit, that deficit is recognised in the statement of financial performance in the period it arises. In subsequent periods any revaluations surplus that reverses previous revaluation deficits is recognised as revenue in the statement of financial performance.

Depreciation has been calculated using rates management deemed to be most appropriate based on their use. Gains and losses on disposal of fixed assets are considered in determining the operating result for the year.

Building improvements 2%

c) Income Tax

The Club had no taxable income for the period under review.

d) Goods and Services Taxation (GST)

Revenues and expenses have been recognised in the financial statements exclusive of GST except that irrecoverable GST input tax has been recognised in association with the expense to which it relates. All items in the Statement of Financial Position are stated exclusive of GST except for receivables and payables which are stated inclusive of GST.

e) Changes in Accounting Policies

There have been no changes in accounting policies. All policies have been applied on a basis consistent with those from previous financial statements.

f) Inventory

Inventories are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost is determined using the first-in-first-out (FIFO) method.

g) Revenue Policy.

All revenues are reported on an invoice basis.





Report on Canterbury Junior Teams and Individuals 2022

National Junior Teams Championships

Held in Auckland during the first week of the October school holidays, Canterbury sent six junior teams. It has been three years since the last nationals were held owing to Covid. We sent strong teams but stiff opposition came from the fast developing associations of North Shore and, as always, Auckland.

The under 19 boys team won the silver medal after making the final against Auckland. Although they lost the final 4-1, they had opportunities to extend the contest further if lady luck had been on their side. Sang Yong led the team and was backed up by the fast improving Griffin Buchanan, Josh Kim who played his best table tennis of the year and Leo Mamedov who resides in Auckland.

The under 19 girls team also placed second and with it the silver medal. Again the strong Auckland girls were too good, but Lydia, Vanessa and Aarya were very competitive.

The under 19 boys 2 team came a credible 7th place

out of the 9 under 19 teams, after wins over Northland and Wellington. Standout was Chris Fenwick with 5 wins including 2 wins in the victory over Wellington to clinch 7th place.

The under 15 girls team finished in third place with wins over North Shore 2 and Otago. But the depth of the Auckland and North Shore girls was evident. Our girls all won games which they should have but there were no wins against the top northern sides.

The under 15 boys team had high hopes in the boys A grade but could only manage a 5-2 win against Manawatu, leaving them third in their group. This put them into the playoff for 5th and 6th. They had a strong 4-1 win and finished 5th overall.

The under 13 boys team was ably led by Xavier Reid. They nearly won bronze but tripped up in their match against North Shore 3, going down 2-5. So 4th was a particularly good result considering the depth in North Shore and Auckland. Xavier won 7 out of 9 singles and Mihik won 5 out of 10. It was great to see William Hsia and Marco Ravadilla compete in their first nationals and equip themselves so well. This was a great learning experience for them.

12 SUPERCLUB 2022



A new competition was created this year, to run during the winter interclub season. Called Super Club, it replaced the Super League competition which has run for several years.

Super Club comprised of six club-based teams, competing over fifteen weeks (three rounds of five weeks each), and concluded with a final between to two top qualifiers.

It was designed with some specific principals in mind. Firstly, it is club representation based, with team personal selected by their club on a week-by-week basis (although in practice most teams remained largely unchanged throughout). This is to promote meaningful competition and rivalry.

Super Club utilises an eight-match format, with a minimum of three players in each team, competing for six singles and two doubles. Despite the opportunity for draws, there was a surprisingly small number of 4-4 results throughout the season.

One of the main objectives was to bridge the gap between the 'top' competition and Division 1 of interclub, thus creating pathways for players to develop into the higher echelon. The 2022 Super Club season saw several examples of players showing that they could compete well at the highest level. Players such as Griffin Buchanan, Anthony Wilson and Aaron Tian, among others, responding to the challenge well, and showing that they belong in the top competition.

Another objective was to achieve a sustainable level. In previous years the Super League competition has started out strong, but waned as the season progressed. Whilst Super Club perhaps achieved a reasonably constant level, it might be worth looking at a shorter version in future to attain this objective.

The inaugural Super Club competition was won by Kirwee Club, predominantly represented by John Cordue, Han Jong Eub and Simon Wallace (with appearances also by Kris Alisch and Gregg Davey). Harewood Club were also well represented and finished a close second.
